



Peatland




All kinds of agricultural and forestry feedstocks can be certified under ISCC



























ISCC is also a leading certification system for waste and residues as well as non-bio feedstocks






ISCC feedstock certification on a global scale






ISCC certification can be applied for all markets






ISCC is a one stop shop, and is compliant with many important platforms and industry standards






Regional distribution of ISCC certificates. In Latin America, currently 135 ISCC certificates are valid

ISCC in Latin America – The numbers of ISCC certificates in Colombia and Central America have increased in the previous year






Examples of certified companies in the top five countries
