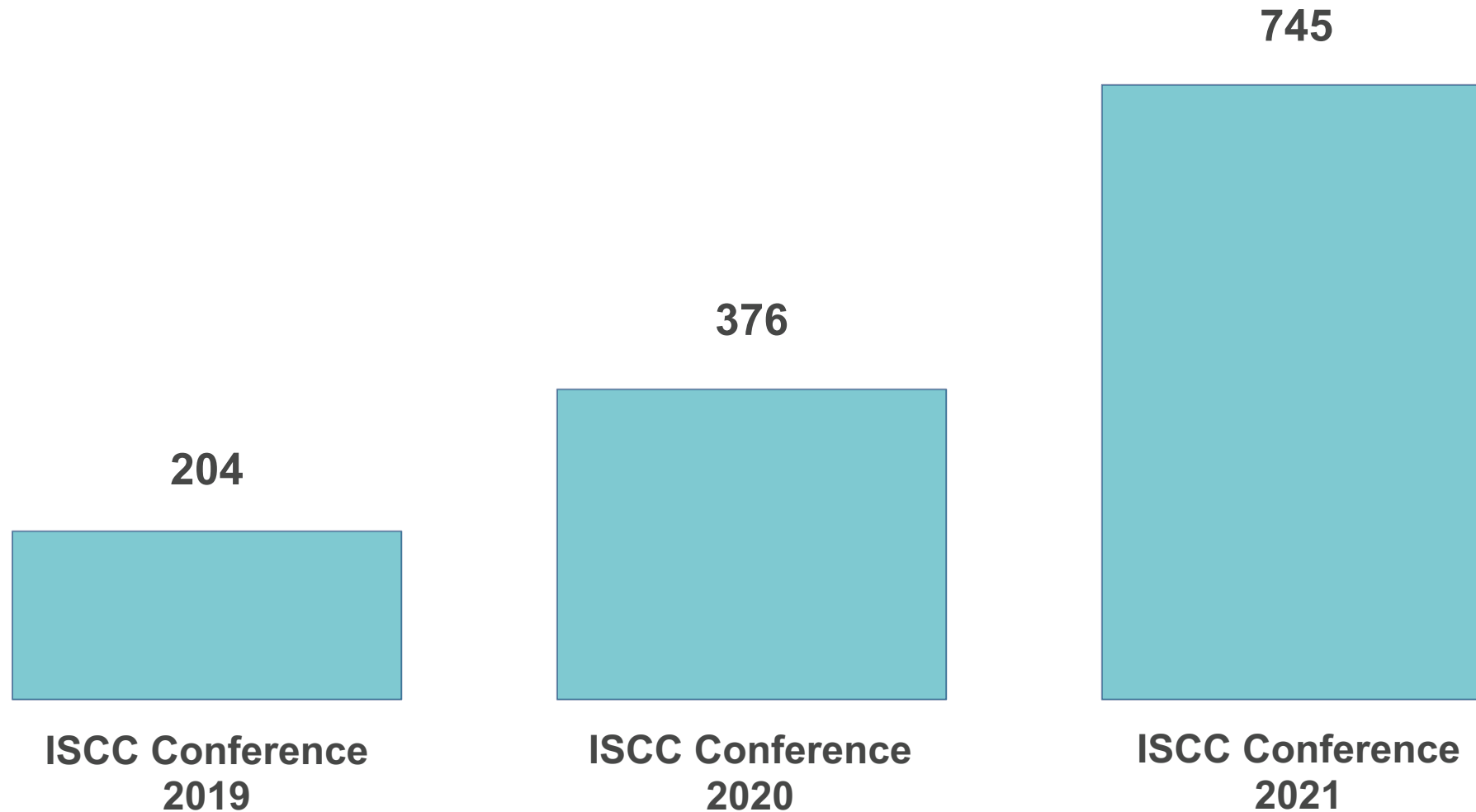


Robust multi-stakeholder system

- New raw materials, supply chains, technologies, products
- Revision and updates of ISCC PLUS documents
- New topics: e.g. renewable electricity, LCA
- Continuous engagement with stakeholders and different initiatives
